What are the Fees? What is the breakdown?

- Single User License: Payable to FastForWord
- Consultant Fee: \$1500 payable to Speech & Language Consultants, LLC
- Consultant + Coach Fee: \$2000

1. How long have you been providing Fast ForWord® products?

Landria Seals, SLP and graduate of Northwestern University, clinic director has been a Fast ForWord provider for approximately 5 years of her 10 years as a speech-language pathologist.

2. Which Fast ForWord products have you used and how many children have you run on the program?

Our office has run over 15 adults and children on the Fast ForWord Language, Language to Reading, Fast ForWord Literacy, Fast ForWord Literacy Advanced, and Reading 1 programs.

3. How much do you charge if you're running the products off-site? What are your fees based on.

The Consultant only fee is \$1750. For those that require a coach, a fee of \$2250.00 is assessed per family. Families are required to pay 50% of the consultant fee is due at the time of pre-testing (one month in advance). The remaining balance is due by the client's first date of Fast ForWord training..

Our fees are based on pre-testing, purchase of headphones, ongoing monitoring including weekly teleconference plus consultant, home monitoring visits for three scheduled visits (initial start date, midpoint, and final week), weekly summaries provided via electronic mail and final summaries are prepared for clients

4. How much do you charge if you're running the products on-site?

We no longer provide onsite FastForWord programs onsite. Should a family need an onsite program, the consultant and coaching plus license fees apply.

5. Do you require pre-testing?

Yes. SLC will conduct initial testing and a file review to assess the appropriateness of the program.

6. What pre-testing do you use? Is this testing comprehensive?

SLC will conduct a file review to determine most recent testing. Some examples of testing that may be conducted by us may include the CELF, OWLS, GORT, CASL, ITPA. The pre-testing for SLC potential FastForWord families include one testing protocol to gain standardized scores. This pre-testing is used in conjunction with the file review to create a learner profile and communicate expectations of the FastForWord program.

7. How long have you been a clinical professional?

Landria Seals, a native Chicagoan and the clinic director of Speech & Language Consultants, has been a clinical professional for approximately ten years. She has worked with children and adults with neurological disorders including auditory processing, PDD, learning disabilities, traumatic brain injuries, and many more.
